

Commitment to the FSC and PEFC Chain of Custody Policy

SAICA PAPER is a company committed to environmental improvement and customer satisfaction.

In addition, it is committed to implementing and maintaining compliance with the FSC and PEFC organisations' Chain of Custody to promote the consumption of paper from responsible sources, such as post-consumer recovery, as well as promoting the sustainable use of resources, thereby helping to reduce the over-exploitation of forests.

Therefore, it identifies the origin and percentage of pre-consumer and post-consumer recovered materials used, and is thus able to display the FSC and PEFC logos on recycled products.

It is also committed to the values behind the FSC and PEFC policies, publicly stating not to be involved directly or indirectly with any of the following:

- a) The illegal trade in timber or timber products,
- b) The violation of human rights or traditional forestry,
- c) The destruction of high conservation values,
- d) The conversion of natural forests to plantations or other uses,
- e) The introduction of genetically modified organisms in forest management,
- f) The violation of the Conventions of the ILO.


This organisation also promotes social and health and safety at work requirements by doing the following:

- ✓ allowing workers to associate freely, and to choose their representatives for collective bargaining with the company,
- ✓ promoting equal opportunities and treatment for workers,
- ✓ detecting, controlling and preventing working conditions that endanger the health or safety of workers.
